## Introduction to Crimbles Court

Crimbles Court is a sheltered scheme located in Pudsey town centre, and is also close to Bramley centre.

The scheme comprises of both bungalows and flats. There are 40 one bedroom flats and 11 one bedroom bungalows. Each property consists of a lounge, kitchen, bathroom and one bedroom.

The scheme has laundry facilities located in the community centre. It has a washing machine and a dryer for the residents' use. There are also garages to rent, should you wish to store a car.

The flats operate a door entry system, and you will be provided with a key that operates this.

Each property is fitted with pull cords that are connected to a 24 hour call centre. Assistance can be summoned directly from this helpline in your warden's absence.

### Heating

The flats are installed with electrical air flow heating, and the bungalows are installed with central heating.

Cooking facilities can be operated either electrically in the flats or gas in the bungalows and below are details of some of the suppliers.

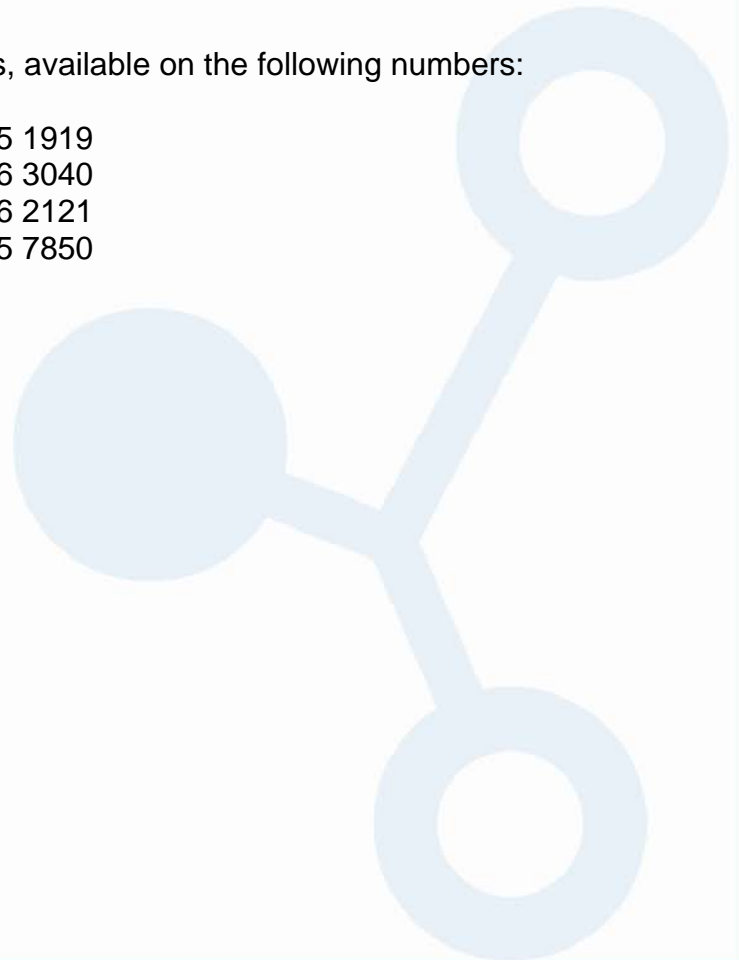
### Bus services to Armley and Bramley Town Centre

## Local area history

**Pudsey is a market town in Leeds, West Yorkshire. Once an independent town, it was included into the metropolitan borough of Leeds in 1974, and is located midway between Bradford and Leeds City centres.**


**Pudsey constitutes the areas of Fartown, Troydale, Littlemoor, Lowtown, Uppermoor and Chapletown. There is also the villiage of Fulneck, the district of Stanningley and part of the district of Tyersal.**

**The name Pudsey occurs in the 1086 Domesday books as “Podechesaie” and “Podchesai”, but in the early 6<sup>th</sup> century Pudsey and the neighbourhood appear to have been the centre of the Kingdom of Elmet, which retained its independence for more than 200 years after other more petty kingdoms had been subdued by the Angles.**

**The town was famous in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries for its wool manufacture, and, from the 19<sup>th</sup> century for cricket. Yorkshire cricketers Sir Len Hutton, Herbert Sutcliffe, Ray Illingworth and Matthew Hoggard all learned to play in Pudsey. One of the 19<sup>th</sup> century Yorkshire cricketers John Tunnicliffe was born in Lowtown.**

**During the industrial Revolution, Pudsey was said to be one of the most polluted areas of the UK due to its position within a slight valley and between the two industrial cities of Leeds and Bradford. As a result whichever way the wind blew Pudsey would become covered in thick soot. The temperature inversion created by being in valley led to the soot becoming trapped leading to dense smog in the area. This is believed to have led to jokes that pigeons in Pudsey park flew backwards in order to keep the soot out of their eyes!**

## Local area activities

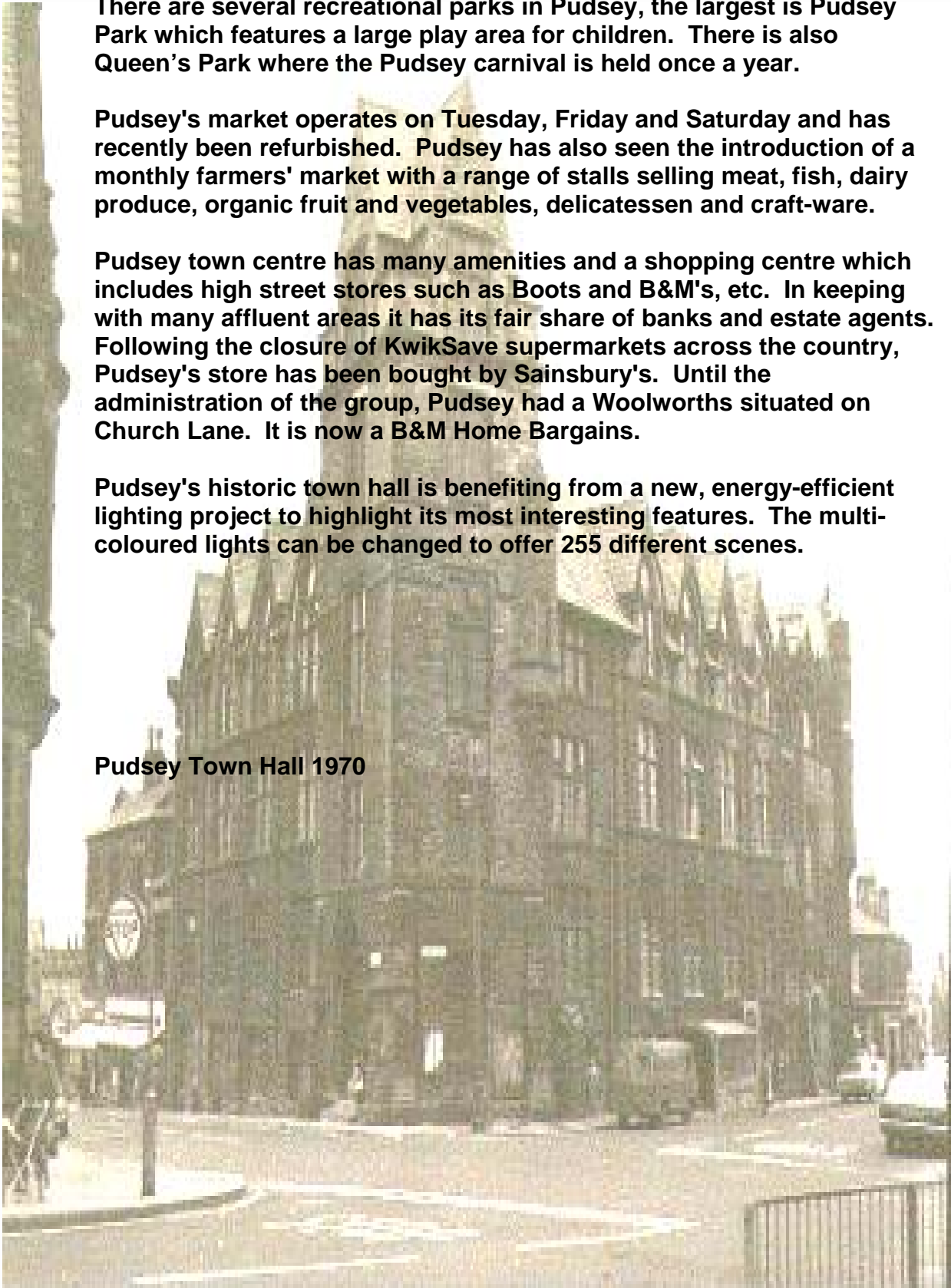
There are several recreational parks in Pudsey, the largest is Pudsey Park which features a large play area for children. There is also Queen's Park where the Pudsey carnival is held once a year.

Pudsey's market operates on Tuesday, Friday and Saturday and has recently been refurbished. Pudsey has also seen the introduction of a monthly farmers' market with a range of stalls selling meat, fish, dairy produce, organic fruit and vegetables, delicatessen and craft-ware.

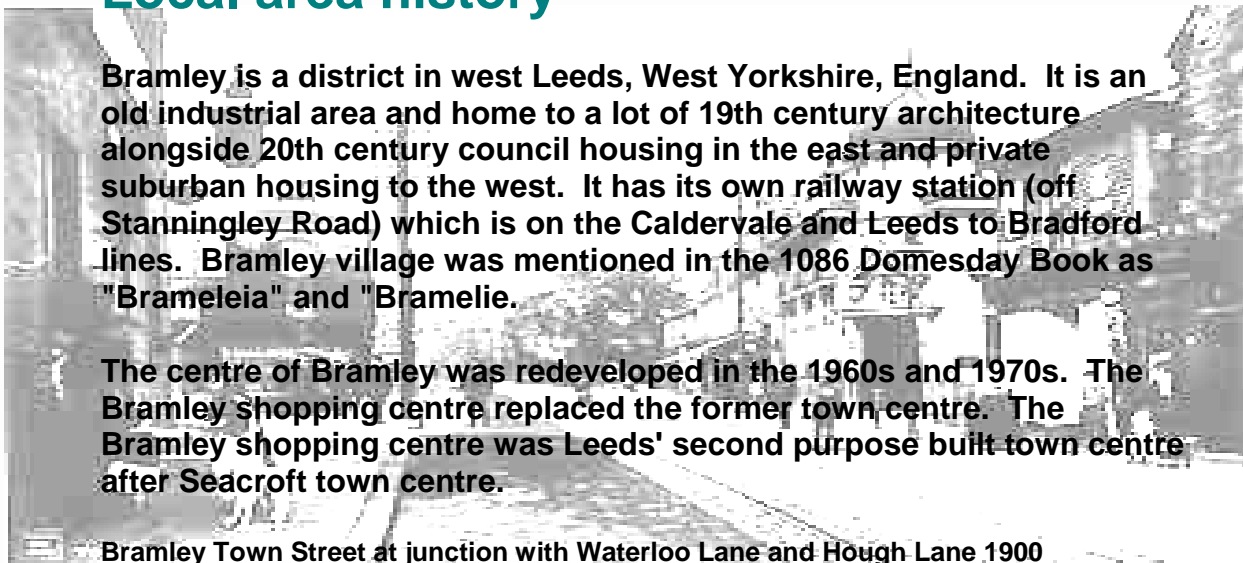
Pudsey town centre has many amenities and a shopping centre which includes high street stores such as Boots and B&M's, etc. In keeping with many affluent areas it has its fair share of banks and estate agents. Following the closure of KwikSave supermarkets across the country, Pudsey's store has been bought by Sainsbury's. Until the administration of the group, Pudsey had a Woolworths situated on Church Lane. It is now a B&M Home Bargains.

Pudsey's historic town hall is benefiting from a new, energy-efficient lighting project to highlight its most interesting features. The multi-coloured lights can be changed to offer 255 different scenes.

## Local area history



Bramley is a district in west Leeds, West Yorkshire, England. It is an old industrial area and home to a lot of 19th century architecture alongside 20th century council housing in the east and private suburban housing to the west. It has its own railway station (off Stanningley Road) which is on the Caldervale and Leeds to Bradford lines. Bramley village was mentioned in the 1086 Domesday Book as "Brameleia" and "Bramelie.

The centre of Bramley was redeveloped in the 1960s and 1970s. The Bramley shopping centre replaced the former town centre. The Bramley shopping centre was Leeds' second purpose built town centre after Seacroft town centre.

## Local event history

Between the years 1631 and 1903 some momentous events took place, all of which affected many lives of the people of Bramley in particular – here are a just a few of them:-

- 23.02.1631 Bramley Old Church was erected
- 07.10.1749 John Wesley preached in Bramley
- 19.01.1827 First stone laid on Stocks Hill
- 03.10.1844 Bramley supplied with gas
- 19.06.1846 Zion Baptist Chapel opened
- 24.04.1854 Catholic Chapel opened in Bramley
- 26.01.1857 Police first stationed in Bramley
- 02.04.1858 Wesley Place Chapel founded
- 08.09.1861 Last service in Bramley Old Church
- 24.09.1861 Bramley Old Church spire pulled down
- 04.11.1865 Moriah School Bramley, founded
- 15.10.1868 Wesley Place School, Bramley, opened
- 09.05.1872 Bramley Workhouse opened
- 14.07.1875 Explosion at Waterloo Mill, Bramley
- 18.06.1887 Queen Victoria's Jubilee celebrated
- 05.02.1896 Funeral of W.E. Yates, Esq
